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1.0 Introduction

The recreation programs assessment reviews the City of Burlington's recreation program and service offerings through a series of individual analyses. BerryDunn reviewed the results of these analyses from a global perspective. This recreation assessment report offers detailed insight into the Burlington's recreation program offerings and helps identify opportunities for effective and efficient delivery of services.

2.0 Program Menu

Burlington offers the following menu of recreational programs to the community. Core program areas include:



Aquatics



Dance



General Recreation



Sports/Martial Arts



Summer Camp

Core Programs

Aquatics

Burlington provides an outdoor pool which features a water slide. Aquatic program analysis was impacted due to a period of shutdown in 2024 for mechanical issues. The city offers public, night, and lap swimming, water exercise and swim team practices.

Dance

Burlington offers dance classes through a partnership with Soul Steppin' Studio. The dance program features a wide variety of recreational and competition dance classes for all ages, with a specific focus on ages 3 to 18. Classes are offered twice a week.

General Recreation

General recreation are offerings not considered core programs due to limited participation or limited encompassment of a broader age range:

- Blast Ball
- Flag Football
- Splash Pad

Sports

Sports programming is strong at Burlington with a variety of sports programs for all ages including:

- Adult Co-ed Softball
- Martial Arts
- Youth Soccer
- Summer Baseball/Softball
- Youth Basketball
 - Including skills camp
- Youth Volleyball
 - Including skills camp

Summer Day Camp

Burlington offers summer day camp for two age groups, 4-5 years, and 6–7-year-olds. The day camps are programmatically themed and held on various days from Jun 11th to July 9th.

Special Events

Although not a core program area, Burlington offers the following special events.

- Breakfast with Santa
- Celebration of Summer
- Craft Fair
- Gift Gala
- Spring Fling

Program Inventory

The following is a list of major program categories that park and recreation agencies throughout the country commonly provide. This list helps to identify whether there are any common program areas not offered by an agency. In matching Burlington's inventory of programs against the list, approximately 14% are represented. However, Burlington's population at under 4,000, indicates recreation programming similarities in communities with similar size. It is helpful to conduct this analysis at a broader level, inclusive of diverse communities, to assess possibilities and opportunities in Burlington. The community engagement and full report analysis will help further identify priorities of future programming needs specific to Burlington. Figure 1 illustrates program categories. Gray tiles represent programs not offered and opportunities for program menu expansion if aligned with community need. It is important to note that amenities, like

tennis courts, are provided by Burlington for general use. This program assessment is specific to active programming occurring in these categories.

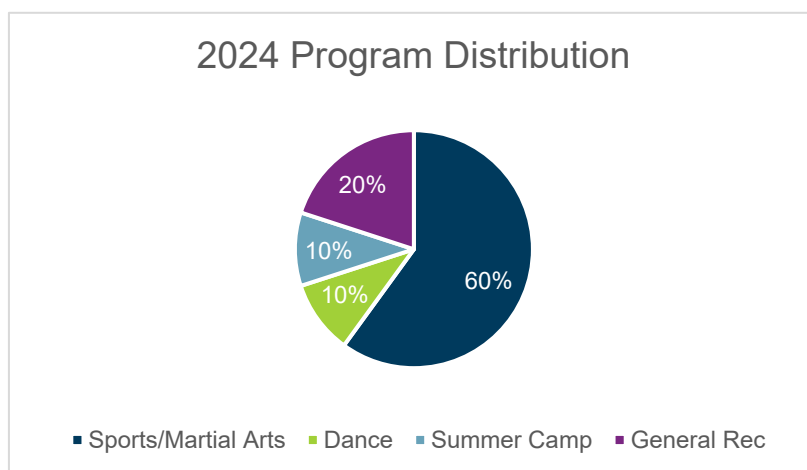

Program Distribution

Understanding how Burlington's program menu is distributed across the program categories helps to identify the extent of programming within each category in relation to the whole. Figure 2 captures the quantity of total registration-based programming offered by the Burlington during the year examined and depicts how the programming was distributed across program categories*.

**Aquatics is not tracked as program registration by Burlington and is not included in this program distribution analysis of total program registration*

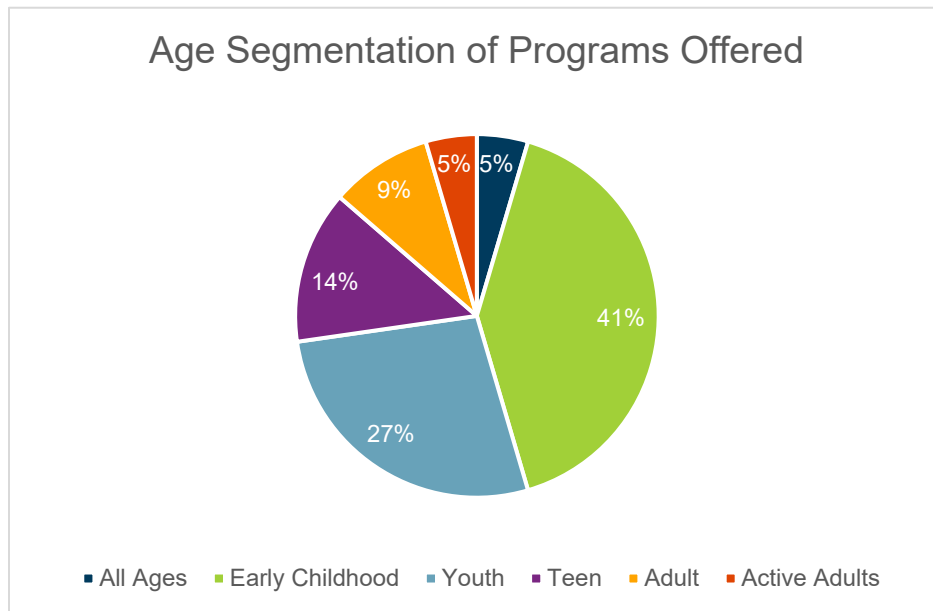
Age Segmentation

The age segment analysis reviews the distribution of the program offerings according to the age segments serviced. For the purposes of this assessment, BerryDunn delineated age categories according to the following age structure:

- Early Childhood, ages 0 – 5 years
- Youth, ages 6 – 12 years
- Teen, ages 13 – 17 years
- Adult, ages 18 – 64 years
- Active Adults, ages 65+ years
- All Ages

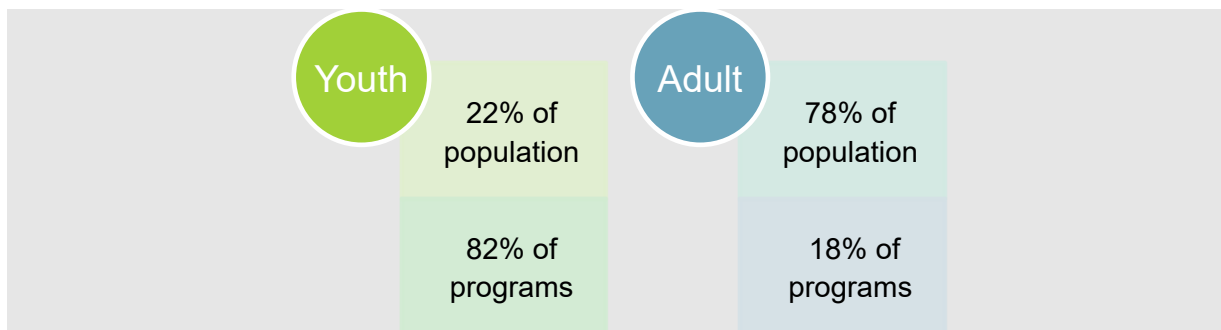
BerryDunn tallied the number of registration-based program opportunities geared toward age groups in 2024. If a program section clearly spanned age categories (e.g., ages 5 – 8), BerryDunn counted that section in Early Childhood and Youth. Figure 3 displays Burlington's 2024 program offering percentages according to each age segment.

Figure 3: Age Segmentation of Programs Offered



It is typical for agencies to offer a majority of programs to ages 0 – 17 years. Burlington's 82% is in line with its peers. The age segmentation analysis is one helpful method to review the Burlington's programming related to the community demographics. Demographic data also can be helpful to consider how programming efforts are aligned with the makeup of the community. The adjacent comparison of the community's population and enrollment-based program offerings in Figure 4 demonstrates two key age segments' relationship between the population percentage and the percentage of programs offered.

Figure 4: Population vs. Program Menu



The majority (66%) of Burlington's programs are designed for youth, while the youth age segment represents 72% of the community's population. Adults ages 18 years and older make up 78% of the population, while 18% of programs are designed for adults. The notion of offering a majority of programming for youth is consistent with most park and recreation agencies' program menus across the country (the typical range is between 60% and 75%). The program menu's segmentation does not need to mirror the community's age demographic segmentation in an exact manner; however, an ongoing goal can be to balance the menu toward a reflection of the community makeup.

3.0 Program Performance

In addition to assessing the menu of programs as offered, it is helpful to assess how the programs perform. The extent of program performance can be measured by enrollment, financial performance and cost recovery, participant demographics, cancellation rates, wait lists, and participant reach.

Enrollment

Total annual enrollment into Burlington's core programs was 821, based on data provided from 2023-2024. Sports had the highest enrollment with 726 participants, followed by dance with 65, and camp with 30. Figure 6 includes enrollment by program type.

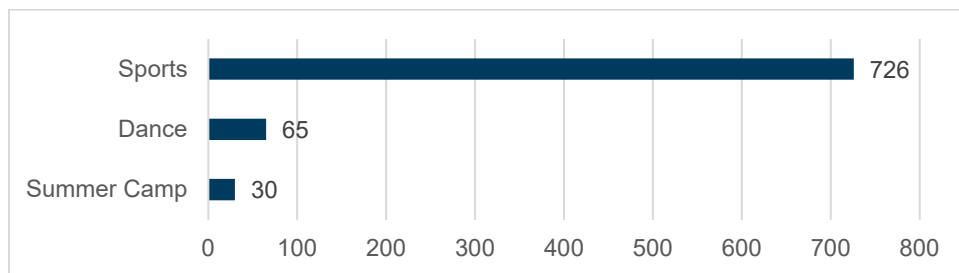
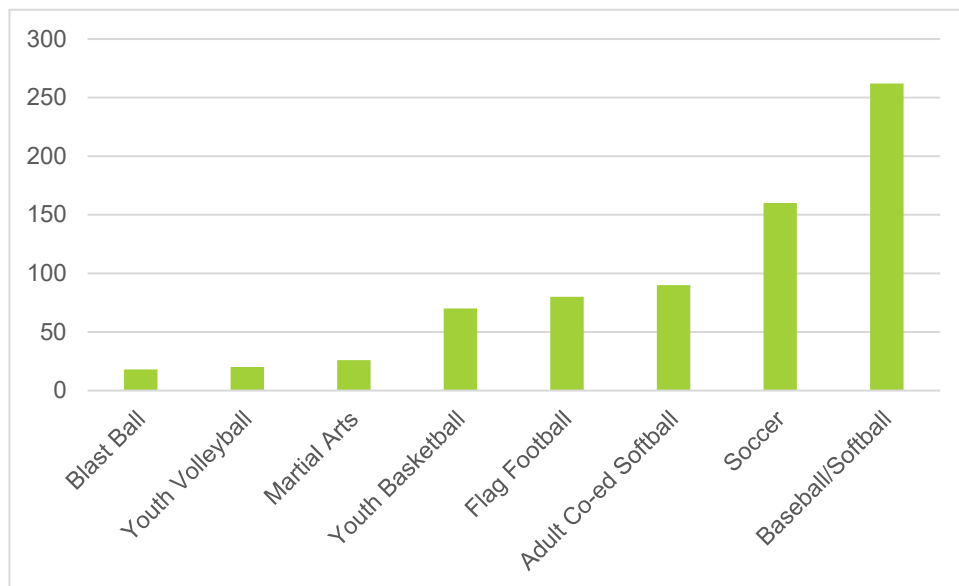


Figure 7: Annual Sports Enrollment

Taking a closer look at sports enrollment, baseball/softball (which includes 7 different programs for both youth and adults) had the highest participation with 262, followed by soccer at 160, and then adult co-ed softball at 90. Figure 7 includes all sports enrollment.

Figure 6: Annual Enrollment by Core Program Area

It will be included as important information to combine with other components of the master planning effort. Core to the creation of a vision and master plan recommendations are all components of the planning effort. For the recreation assessment, future program recommendations should be supported by other master planning efforts, notably:

- Engagement - what is desired from the Burlington community
- Market Analysis - understanding the current and future demographics and usage patterns
- Level of Service – what parks, facilities, trails, and other physical resources exist currently and will be developed in the future

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Benchmarking Study

BerryDunn completed this benchmarking study for the City of Burlington (Burlington) to understand how park and recreation agencies in National Recreation and Park Association's (NRPA's) Midwest regions compare in terms of staffing, population, jurisdiction size, finances, operations, and program/service offerings to that of Burlington.

Due to the population size and unique characteristics of Burlington, it is challenging to find suitable neighboring communities for benchmarking. As a result, BerryDunn utilized data from agencies serving populations of less than 20,000 residents within the NRPA's Midwest region. Although the NRPA did not disclose the specific reporting agencies in the report, it provided aggregate results from eight agencies with similar populations, budgets, and service offerings. The NRPA's Midwest region encompasses the states of Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Wyoming. It should be noted that Burlington's population is in the lower quartile of the Midwest agencies benchmarked. Anecdotally, for a Colorado town of Burlington's population they exceed the norm for park and recreation amenities and services offered to their community.

Benchmarking communities can be an effective tool in fostering a deeper understanding of high-performing agencies' operations and budgets. Benchmarking analysis often clarifies how other agencies manage their budgets, generate revenue, offer programs, and run their facilities.

The intent of benchmarking is not to make a one-to-one comparison with other agencies, as each jurisdiction has its own identity, ways of conducting business, and community needs. The political, social, economic, and physical characteristics of each community make the policies and practices of parks and recreation agencies unique. Additionally, organizations do not typically measure or define various metrics the same way for parks, trails, facilities, and maintenance. Still, benchmarking offers a helpful perspective.

Population and Size

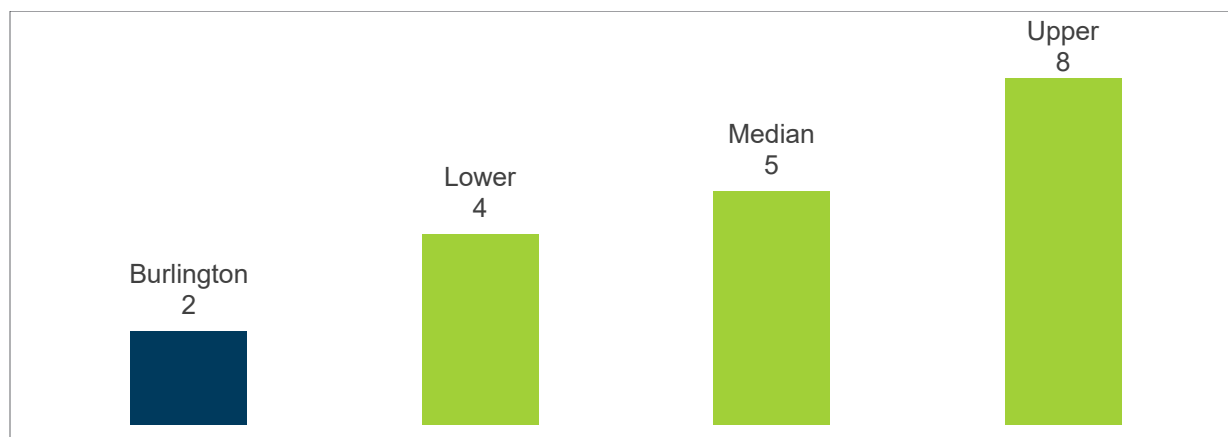
The agencies in this study range in population from 3,114 (Burlington) to 9,781, placing Burlington as an outlier, below the lower quartile with a population below 4,000.

In terms of jurisdiction size, measured in square miles, the benchmarked agencies range from 2 square miles (Burlington) to 8 square miles. Burlington has the smallest area compared to benchmark agencies.

Figure 2: Size of Jurisdiction – Benchmarked Comparison (Square Miles)



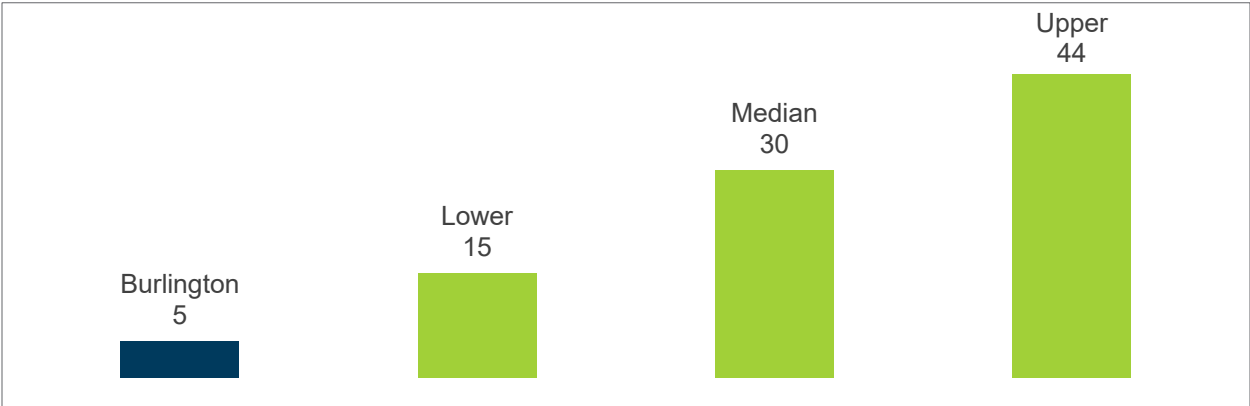
Employees in the Workforce

The following section analyzes the total number of full-time equivalent (FTE) employees. FTEs per agency ranged from 5 (Burlington) to 44 (Upper). In terms of FTEs per 1,000, the median is 3.53. Compared to the lower (2.21), median (3.53), and upper (4.50) categories, Burlington has a lower proportional number of FTEs compared to others in the given population ranges.

Capital and Operating Budget Overview

The following section reviews operating and capital improvement budgets for 2024. Data from the study indicates that operating budgets typically were between \$730,000 (Burlington) and \$12.6 million (Upper) per agency; capital budgets ranged from \$100,450 (Burlington) to \$1.1 million (Upper). The median for operating and capital budgets are \$4.1 million and \$684,852, respectively. Proportional to its population, Burlington has a significantly lower budget than the median.

Figure 4: Agency Operating Budget – Benchmarked Comparison

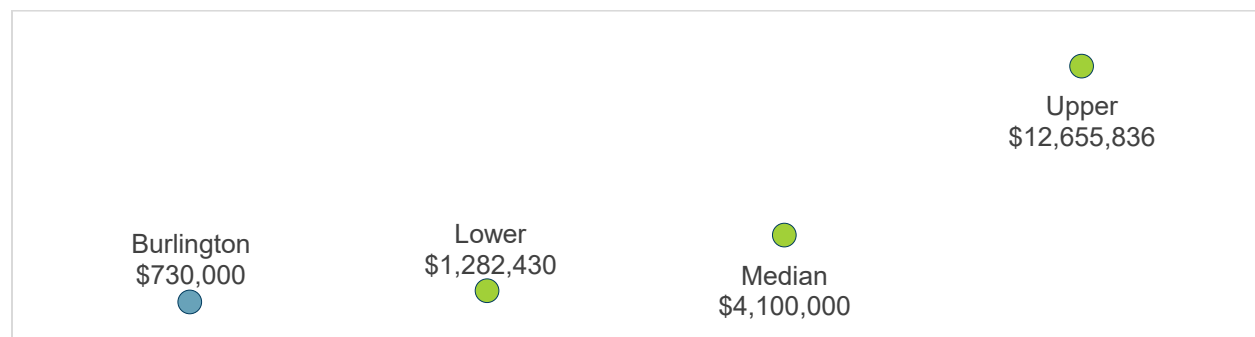
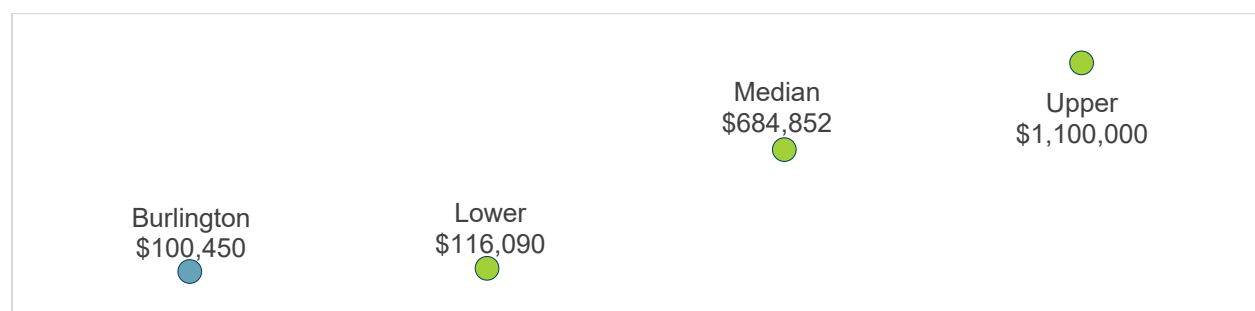


Figure 5: Agency Capital Budget – Benchmarked Comparison



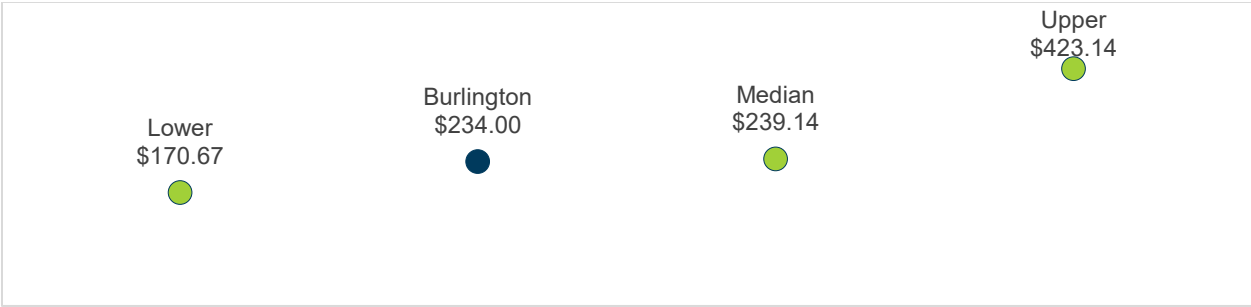
Expenditures per Capita

This section identifies each agency’s overall operating expenditures. The median is \$239.14 per capita. Burlington’s expenditures are nearly at the median.

Programs and Services

Recreation programs are core services of parks and recreation agencies. Program type varies by a number of factors, including facility space, staff/instructor availability and expertise, alternative service providers in the area, benefit to the community, and program demand. Table 5 shows what percentages of NRPA's Midwest region agencies offer common recreation programs. Burlington has significant opportunities to expand its program offerings, particularly in areas like Health and Wellness Education, Safety Training, and Fitness Enhancement Classes, where the Midwest region shows strong participation. By addressing these gaps, Burlington can better meet the needs of the community.

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Trends

Introduction

This report aims to provide Burlington with a high-level overview of the state of parks and recreation nationwide, including trends in the following categories:

- Programming
- Policies and procedures
- Engagement
- Participation

By exploring these trends, the agency can gain valuable insights into communities' evolving habits and preferences regarding recreation. These insights can assist the agency in learning more about potential areas for growth, opportunities, improvement, and inclusivity.

Figure 1: Local Participation in Fitness Activities 2024

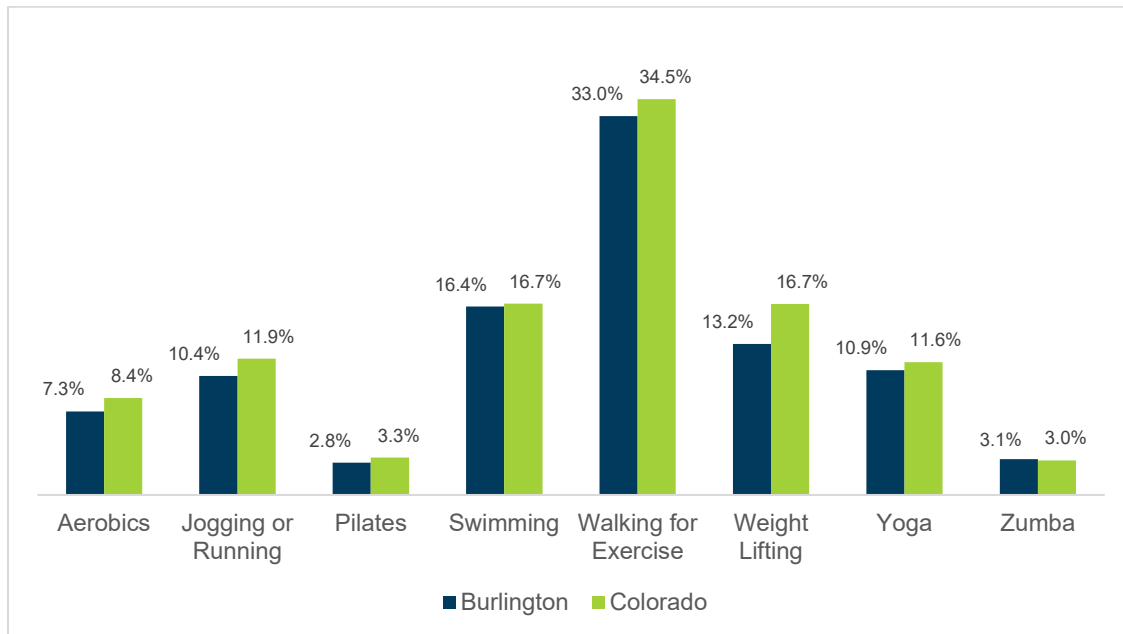


Figure 2: Local Participation in Sport Activities 2024

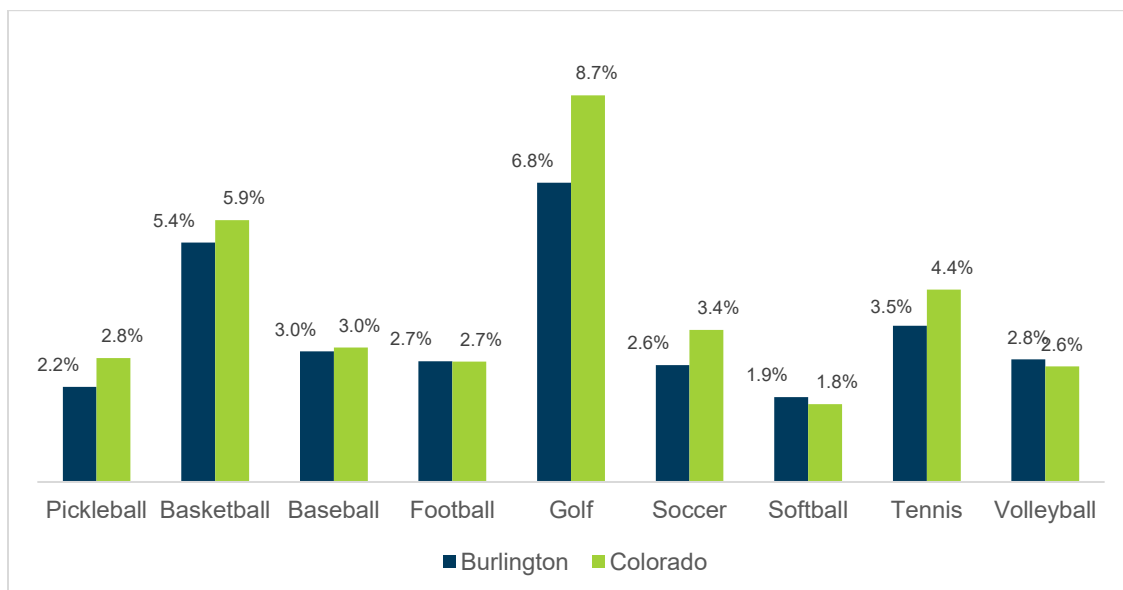
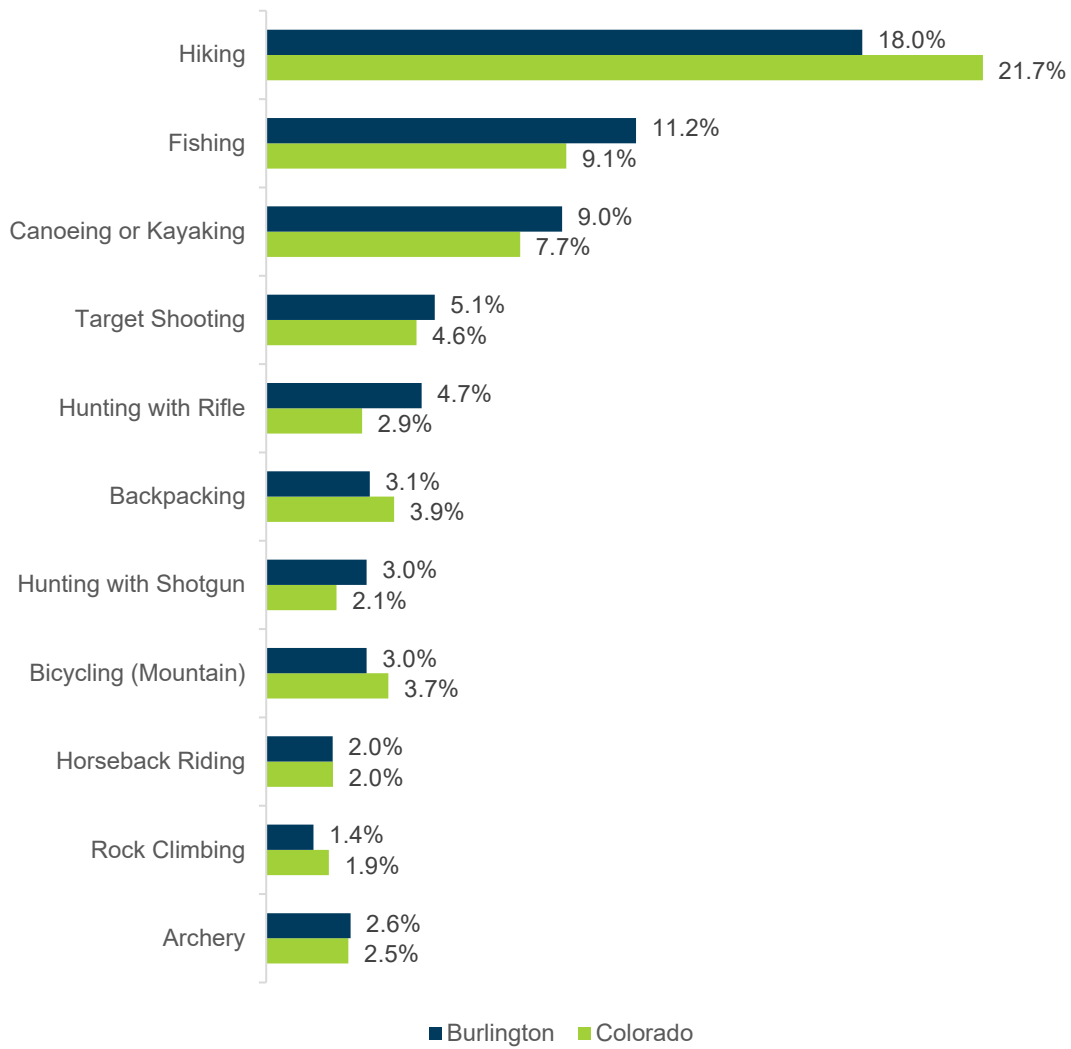


Figure 3: Local Participation in Outdoor Recreation 2024



Local Recreation Expenditures

In 2024, the average expenditure by each city resident on membership fees for social, recreation, and/or health clubs was an estimated \$194.97. Sports, recreation, and exercise equipment expenditures averaged \$217.32. Additional information regarding the average and total recreational expenditures is shown in Tables 1 and 2.

Programming

Per the NRPA Agency Performance Review for 2023, a typical parks and recreation agency will offer approximately 200 programs annually.² The following table depicts the most common types of programs offered by parks and recreation agencies and what percentage of agencies nationwide are offering those programs.

In addition to these trends, NRPA publishes top trends to look out for each year. For 2023, NRPA highlighted the following programming trends:³

Walking activity has declined 36% since 2019.

Pickleball is the fastest growing recreational sport; however, noise complaints have become a major sore spot for nearby residents. USA Pickleball recently approved sound-eliminating equipment, which could help reduce noise by up to 50%.

Cricket is on the rise in some areas, notably among the Southeast Asian population.

Special events—such as family nights, seasonal festivals, and holiday karaoke—are on the rise.

Dog ownership rocketed during the pandemic, which led to a rise in dog parks. Dog parks are now the fastest growing park type, with off-leash dog parks leading the pack.

Fitness Trends

Each year, the ACSM conducts a survey of worldwide fitness trends. Now in its 18th year, the ACSM circulates an electronic survey to thousands of fitness professionals around the world to determine health and fitness trends. The list below includes the top 10 fitness trends for 2024.⁴

1. Wearable Technology

These devices can track heart rate, calories, sitting time, and much more.

2. Worksite Health Promotion

Employers can capitalize on health promotion by fostering health-promoting behaviors such as physical activity and preventive screenings, leading to reduced insurance expenses, heightened productivity, and better mental health.

3. Fitness Programs for Older Adults

Aging heightens susceptibility to chronic illness, cognitive decline, and falls, making regular aerobic and muscle-strengthening exercises critical for mitigating these risks and preserving independence and quality of life as people age.

4. Exercise for Weight Loss

By preserving lean body mass during weight loss endeavors, exercise facilitates sustained and lasting reductions in weight, underlining its significance in long-term weight management strategies.

5. Reimbursement for Qualified Exercise Professionals (QEPs)

This trend represents a shift from previous years' advocacy for licensure for QEPs, which faced significant policy-level obstacles, making it less feasible for the fitness industry globally. Instead, emphasis is now on reimbursement for services provided by QEPs, such as personal trainers and exercise physiologists, acknowledging their role within the healthcare continuum.

6. Employing Certified Exercise Professionals

Employing certified professionals remains a top trend in the health and fitness industry, with companies recognizing the significance of hiring trained individuals to lead fitness programs. Accredited certifications signal to consumers that professionals possess proficient knowledge to assist them in achieving their fitness goals safely.

7. Mobile Exercise Apps

Mobile exercise apps offer flexibility in program delivery, impacting the market with diverse options and proving effective in boosting users' physical activity levels.

8. Exercise for Mental Health

Mental health challenges affect approximately one in every eight individuals globally according to the World Health Organization (WHO), highlighting the widespread significance of this trend. ACSM resources empower exercise professionals to integrate physical activity effectively to support mental health, underscoring the importance of exercise as a holistic approach to wellness.

9. Youth Athletic Development

These initiatives focus on teaching fundamental movement patterns and preparing young individuals for skill acquisition, underscoring the importance of specialized training for exercise professionals working with this demographic.

10. Personal Training

Consumers seeking effective exercise selection, safety protocols, and recovery techniques often find value in personal training services. Exercise professionals equipped with nationally accredited credentials, such as those offered by ACSM, are well prepared to cater to diverse client needs, underscoring the importance of professional certification for ensuring quality service delivery and client satisfaction.

Engagement

NRPA issues an *Engagement with Parks* report each year that provides insights on why people engage with their local parks and recreation agencies. Below are a few highlights from the report, including top reasons people go to parks or facilities, investments visitors would like to see, obstacles to accessing parks and recreation services, and what amenities visitors enjoy most.⁶

Investments People Want to See

- Improve outdoor facilities: 43%
- Improve indoor facilities: 35%
- Improve facility accessibility: 32%
- Increase youth sports opportunities: 29%

Top Reasons People Go to Parks

- Spend time with family and friends: 50%
- Have a break from stress: 47%
- Exercise or be physically fit: 46%
- Be close to nature: 46%

Top Amenities Visitors Enjoy

- Visit a local park, playground, or open space: 66%
- Use a hiking, biking, or walking trail: 47%
- Play sports with family or friends: 30%
- Use a local swimming pool or aquatic center: 28%

Top Obstacles to Accessing Parks and Recreation

- Lack of time: 33%
- Concern about personal safety at the facility: 21%
- Concern about personal safety traveling to the facility: 20%
- Excessive costs or fees: 18%

Participation

This section aims to identify and analyze current trends in sports and recreation, with a particular focus on participation trends derived from the SFIA 2024 Report.⁷ Understanding the latest trends in sports is crucial for Queen Anne's County to effectively plan and develop programs and use space in a way that reflects participation data.



- Basketball is the most popular team sport nationwide, with 29.7 million participants.
- Tennis is the most popular racquet sport, with 23.8 million participants.
- Pickleball participation grew by 51.8% in 2023.
- Walking for fitness is the most prevalent form of aerobic exercise.
- Tai chi saw a 16.3% increase in participation in one year; however, yoga continues to lead in popularity for conditioning activities.
- Dance, step, and other choreographed exercises have grown by 3.3% since 2018, attracting 26.2 million participants each year.
- Ultimate Frisbee has experienced a significant decline in participation (-4.9% since 2018).
- Stationary cycling (group exercise) has been heavily impacted by at-home fitness equipment, declining by 6.2% in five years, with 6.2 million participants.

Top Trending Activities and Five-Year Growth

Figure 9: U.S. Participation by Activity Type 2018 vs. 2023

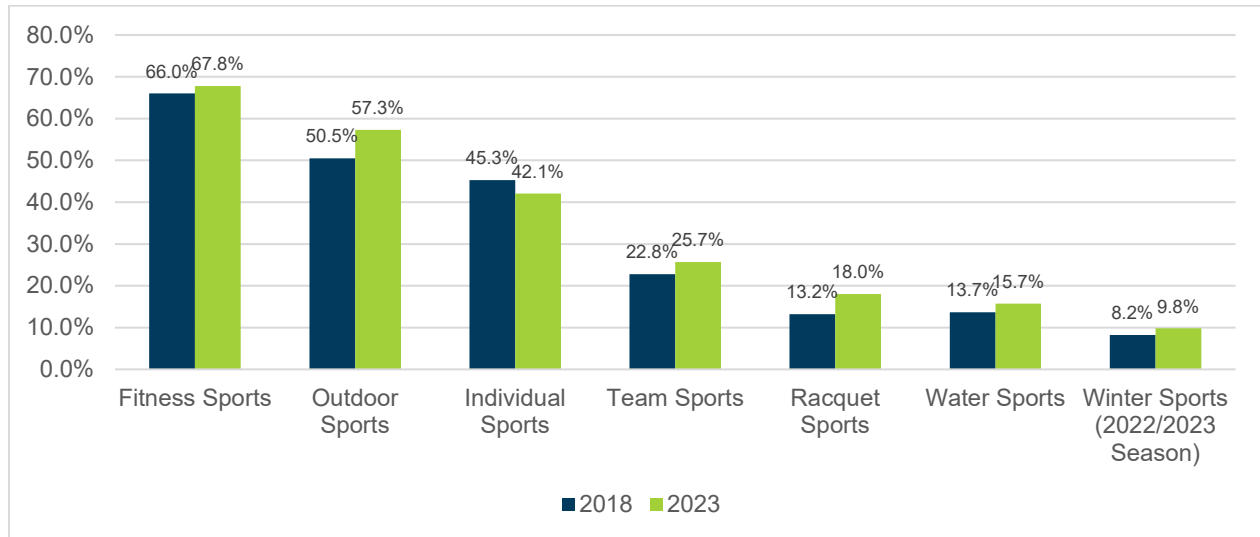

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Introduction

BerryDunn conducted a visitation analysis for the City of Burlington, CO, using mobility data provided by Placer.ai. The insights presented in this report focus on areas such as Parmer Park, the downtown corridor along 14th Street and Rose Avenue, and Lincoln Street near Highway 70. Traffic visitation, park visitation, and tourism data can help support the City in understanding the patterns that can inform operations, staffing, maintenance decisions.

The data provided from Placer.ai is both anonymous and aggregated and should be treated as reliable estimates when being utilized for decision-making. Placer utilizes a proprietary machine learning algorithm that processes billions of anonymized location data points, helping to ensure user privacy while offering detailed insights into movement patterns.

Traffic Visitation Analysis

Placer.ai utilizes traffic data to identify high-traffic locations. The sites selected for the traffic visitation analysis were 14th Street and Lincoln Street. The map incorporates traffic data for those roads as well as other popular roads in the City for 2022 (2023 was not available). Pins for the top businesses in Burlington by visit are also mapped, including fast food restaurants and retail stores.

- Visitation is highest near I-70.
- Rose Avenue also sees significant traffic compared to most other streets, especially between Lincoln Street and 18th Street.
- North of I-70 generally sees more cars per day (8,120) compared to south (7,478).
- Intersections near popular chains like McDonald's and Arby's on Lincoln St./Hwy 70 show some of the highest traffic volumes.
- 14th Street North of Rose Ave. sees more cars per day (2,147) compared to South (540).
- Roads closest to Parmer Park generally see less than 1,000 cars per day.

Figure 1: Traffic Visitation Patterns (2022)



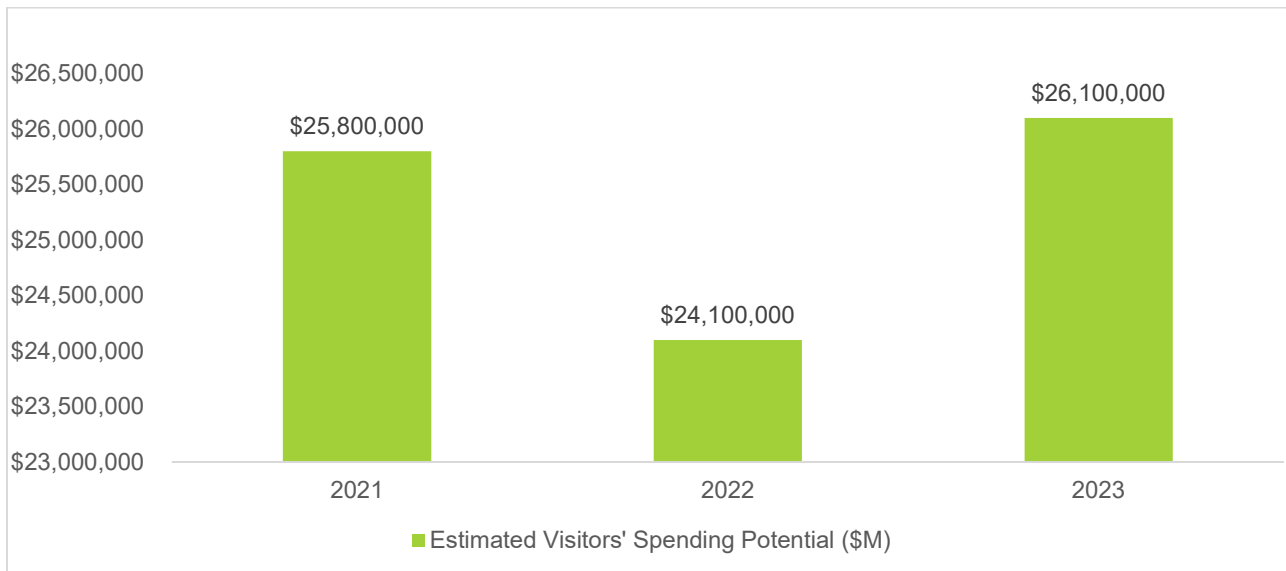
Domestic Travel and Tourism

This section provides an overview of travel and tourism data relevant to the City of Burlington from 2021 to 2023, offering an overview of overnight stays for the calendar years. The data is specific to visitors traveling from their primary residence and visiting the City of Burlington for up to 31 days. Since 2021, overall visitors have declined slightly; however, the number of visit nights has increased to over 148,000 in 2023. The spending potential in 2023 is also demonstrating the highest it has been in three years at over \$26M.

Figure 3: Estimated Visitors' Spending Potential (2021 – 2023)



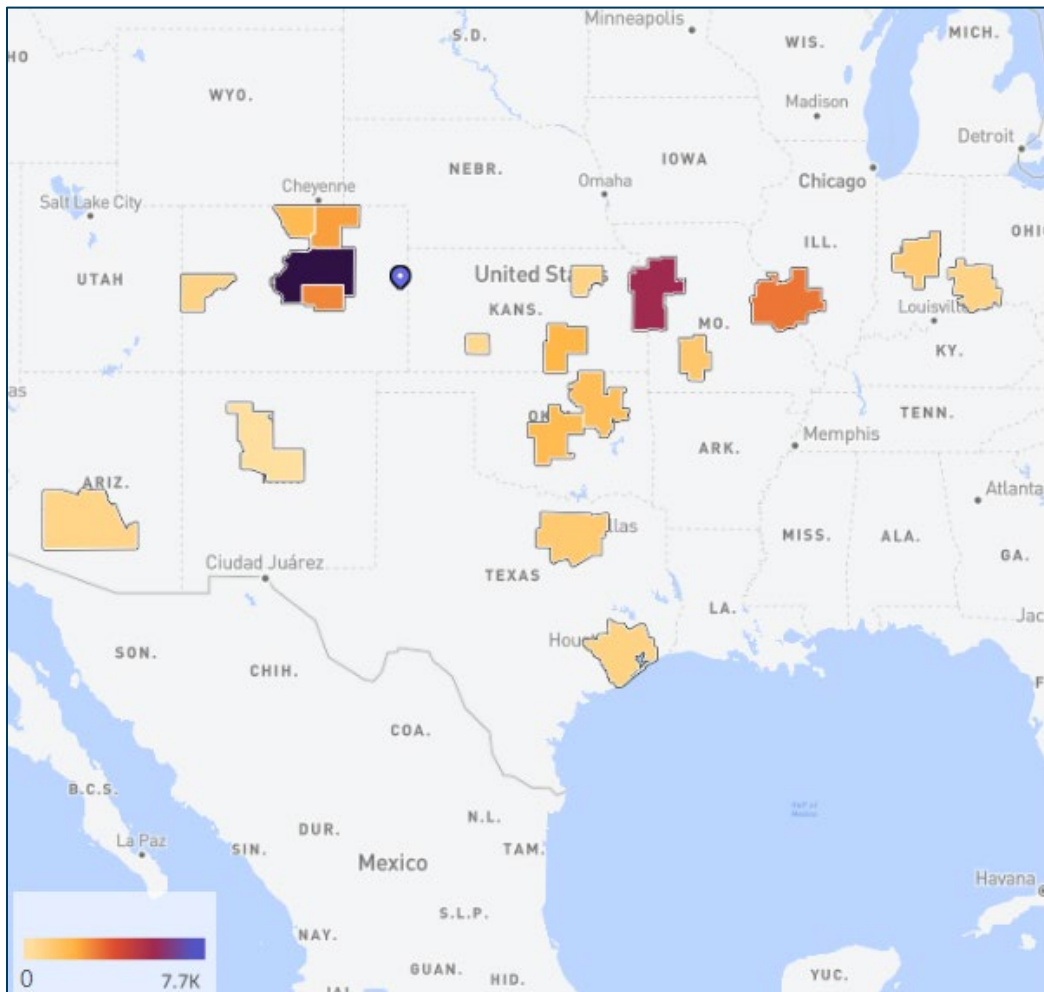
Origin Locations of Burlington Visitors

Related to tourism data, Table 1 shows the visitor origins of the top locations of visitors to Burlington, CO. The top three areas of visitor locations are the Denver-Aurora-Lakewood area, Kansas City, MO, and St. Louis, MO. Visitation from the Denver area has increased since 2021, with an estimated 7,700 visitors in 2023. Increases in visitation have also been seen from Colorado Springs and Greeley, CO. 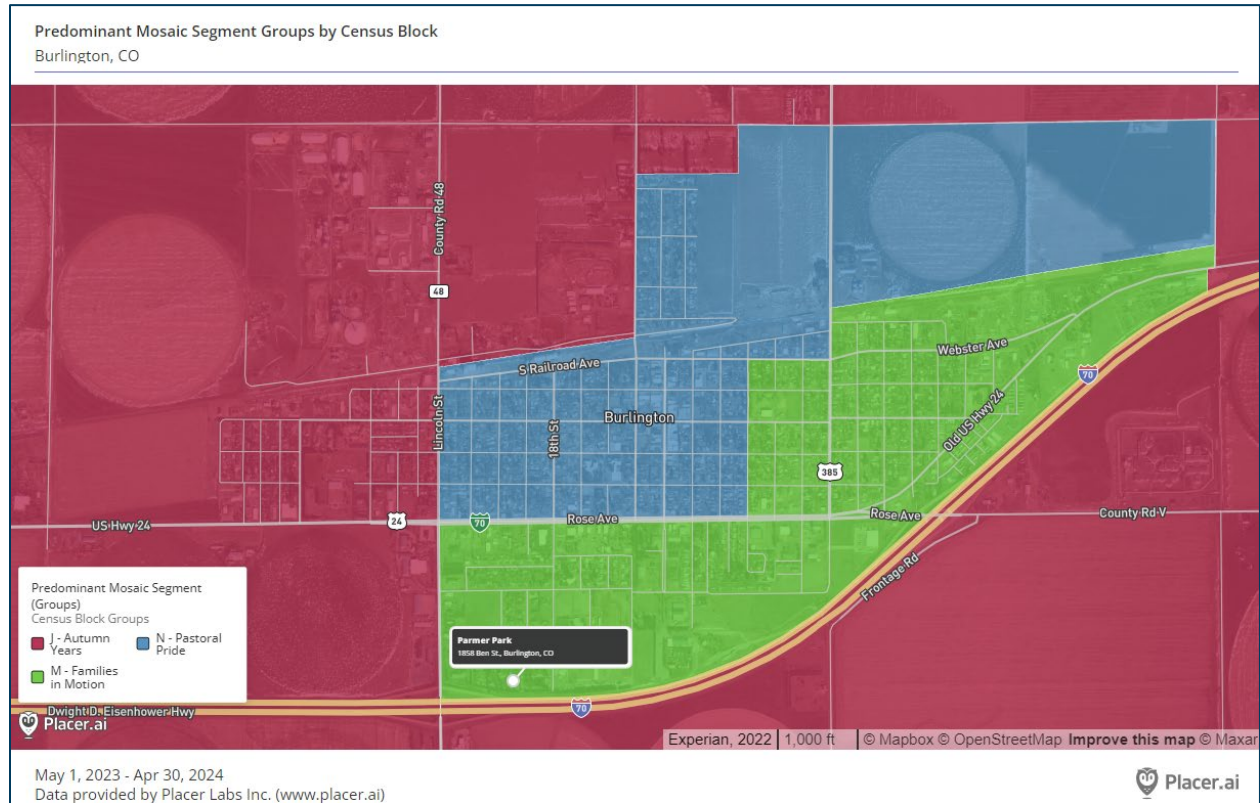

Parmer Park: Overall Visitation Trends

Overall visitation trends are presented in Table 1 from 2021 to 2023. Below is an analysis of the yearly data related to visits, visitors, visit frequency, and average dwell time at Parmer Park over the years 2021, 2022, and 2023.

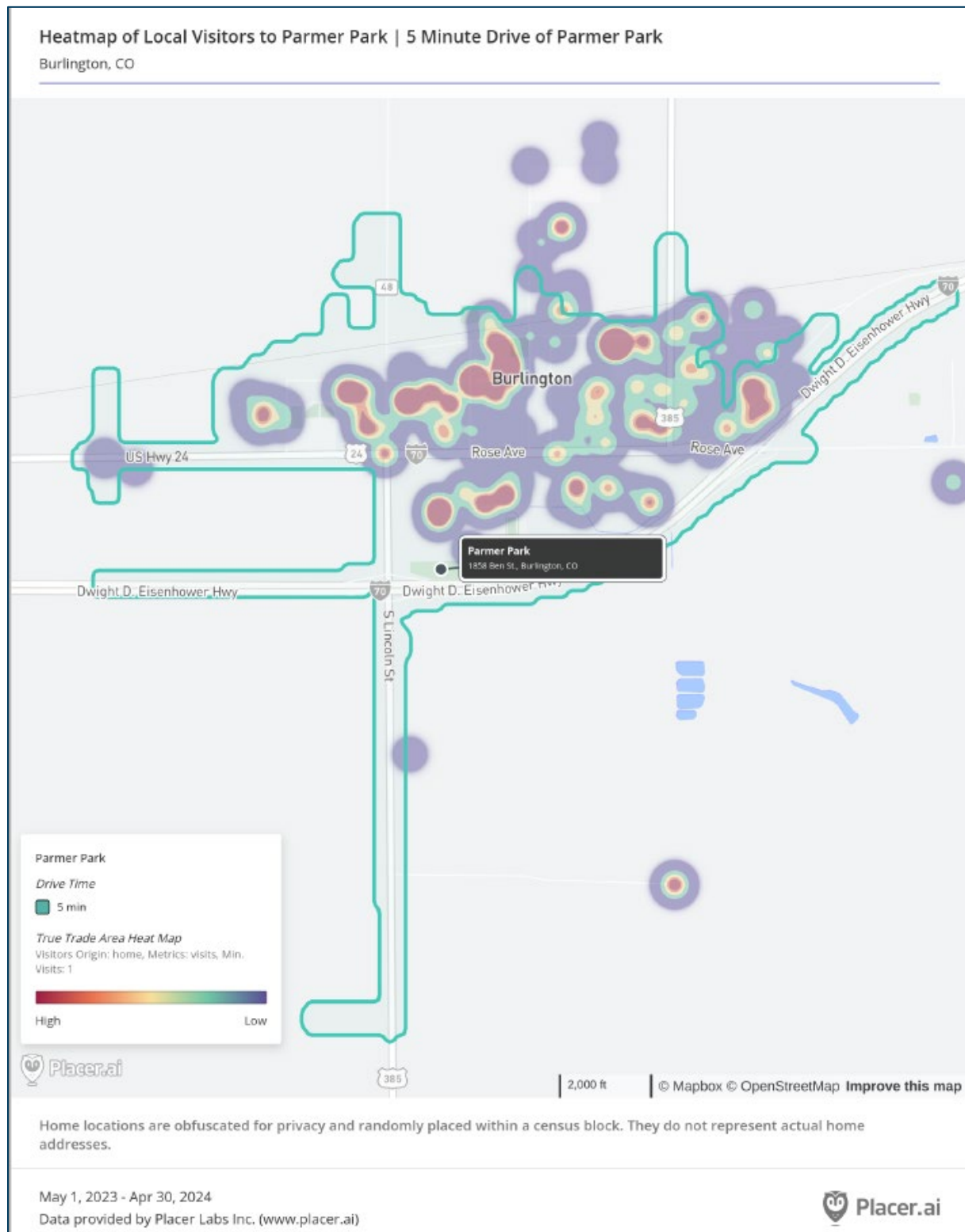
- **Visits** (the number of total of visits at the park greater than 10 minutes per year):
 - There is a slight decline in total visits each year, indicating a gradual decrease in park usage.
- **Visitors** (the number of unique visitors per year):
 - While there was a dip in the number of different visitors in 2022, the count increased in 2023, surpassing the 2021 figure.
- **Visit Frequency** (how often a person visits per year):
 - The frequency of visits per visitor increased in 2022 but then dropped in 2023. This fluctuation could indicate changing visitor habits or the impact of specific events or park offerings.
- **Avg. Dwell Time** (the average time spent at the park):
 - The average duration that visitors spend in the park has been decreasing by about five minutes across three years.

Parmer Park: Demographic Overview

The following demographic characteristics reflect visitors to Parmer Park in 2023.

- **Median Household Income:** The median income of households visiting Parmer Park is \$57.3K, suggesting a moderately middle-income demographic.
- **Education Level:** Approximately 21.5% of visitors hold a bachelor's degree or higher, indicating a significant portion of the park's audience has a college education.
- **Most Common Ethnicity:** The most common ethnicity among visitors is white, making up 70.9% of the park's visitor demographic. It is estimated that 25% of visitors identify as Hispanic or Latino.
- **Persons per Household:** On average, there are 2.39 persons per household, which may indicate that families or couples are frequent visitors.

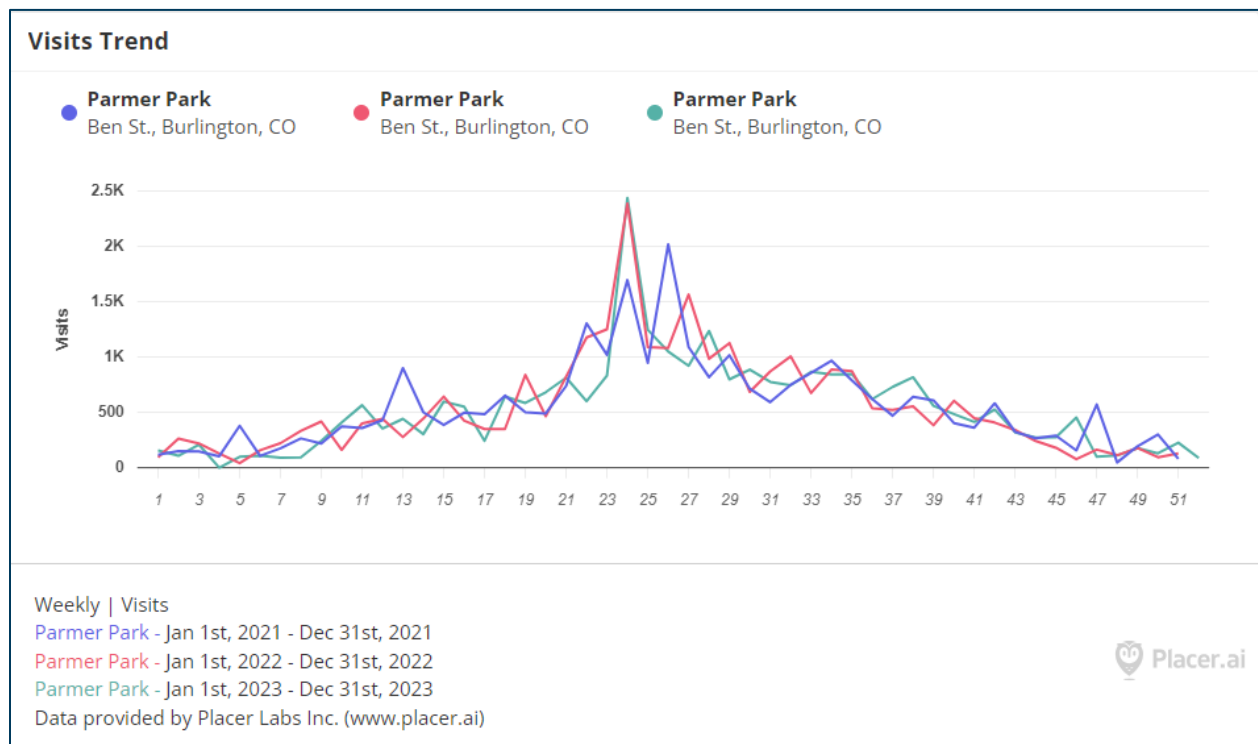

Parmer Park: Weekly Visitation Trends

The chart in Figure 7 represents the weekly number of visits to Parmer Park from 2021 to 2023, highlighting fluctuations and trends over time. The following observations were made from the data:

- The number of visits generally increases as the weather gets warmer, with noticeable peaks during the summer months.
- There's a significant spike in visits around in mid-June, most likely due to the “Celebration of Summer” event that occurs annually.

Figure 7: Weekly Visitation Metrics (2021 – 2023)

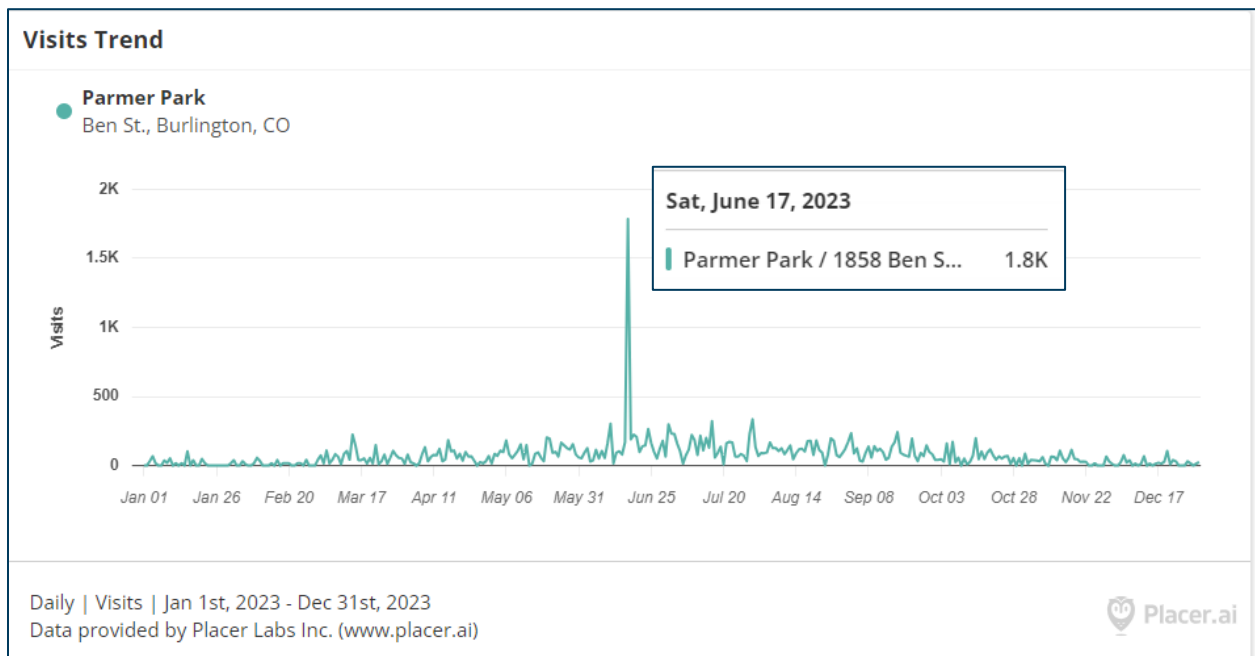


Parmer Park: Visitation Peaks

Most days, Parmer Park sees less than 500 visitors. However, the Celebration of Summer event in 2023 indicates that visits surged to over 1,500. This event typically has a car show, a 5k walk/run, a craft show, cornhole tournaments, and beer/food options.



Figure 8: Visitation Peaks (2023)

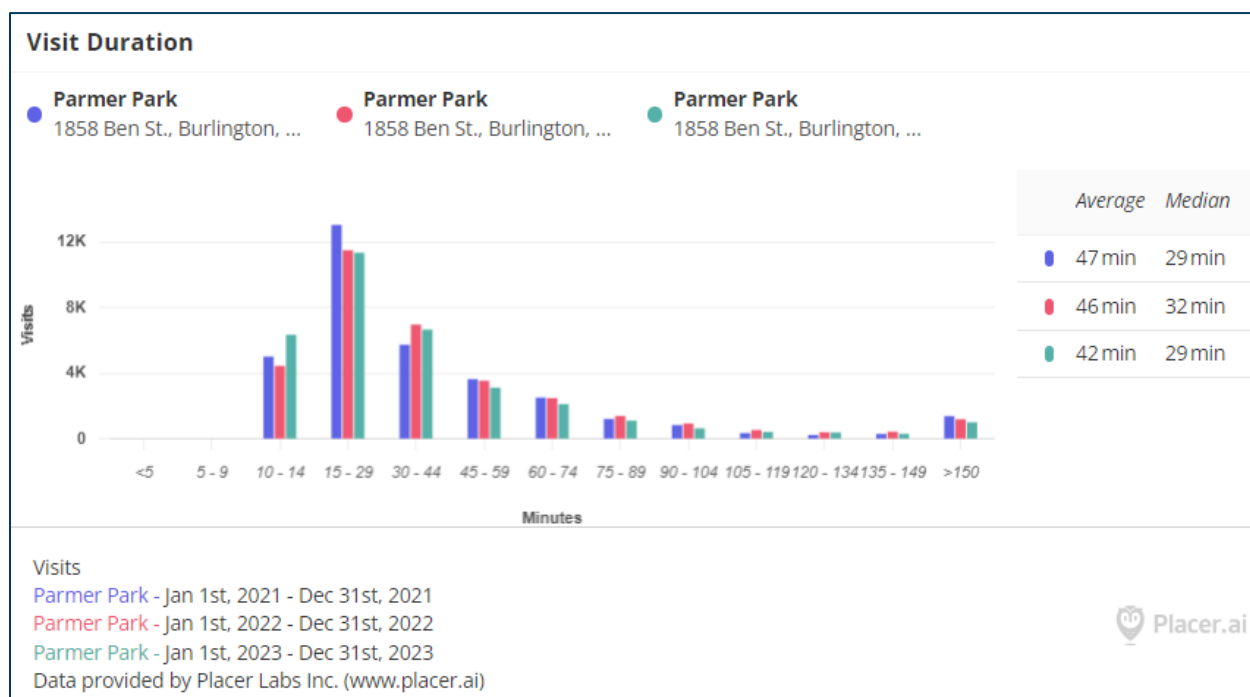


Parmer Park: Visit Duration

Visitors to Parmer Park spent an average of 42 minutes at the park in 2023, down from 47 minutes in 2021.

- The majority of visits are short (less than 30 minutes) with many visitors staying less than 15 minutes. Due to the location of Parmer Park, this is most likely due to travelers on I-70 who are looking for a quick pit stop.
- Fewer visitors stay for more than an hour, which may occur during special events, extensive recreational activities, or family outings.

Parmer Park: Hourly Visitation Patterns

Parmer Park's peak hours are mainly in the afternoon and early evening, especially from noon to 8:00 p.m.

- **Morning (6 a.m. to noon):** Visits start to pick up after 6 a.m., peaking around mid-morning. This suggests that morning might be a popular time for joggers or early walkers.
- **Afternoon (noon to 6 p.m.):** This is the busiest time for the park, with a significant peak around noon and early afternoon. High traffic continues throughout the afternoon. Visitation was the lowest in 2022 in the afternoon.
- **Evening (6 p.m. to 10 p.m.):** Visits start to decline but remain relatively high early in the evening, suggesting that people might come to the park to relax after work. Visitation peaked in 2022 for the evening hours.

Parmer Park: Daily Visitation Patterns

Visits to Parmer Park across the days of the week shows how visitation changes over three consecutive years (2021 to 2023)

- **Monday to Friday:** Visits are relatively lower on weekdays compared to weekends. There's a slight increase on Fridays, suggesting that the park begins to see more visitors as the weekend approaches.
- **Saturday and Sunday:** These are the busiest days of the week, with Sunday visitation being slightly higher than Saturday. This indicates that many people choose to spend part of their weekends at the park.

Figure 11: Daily Visits (2021 – 2023)

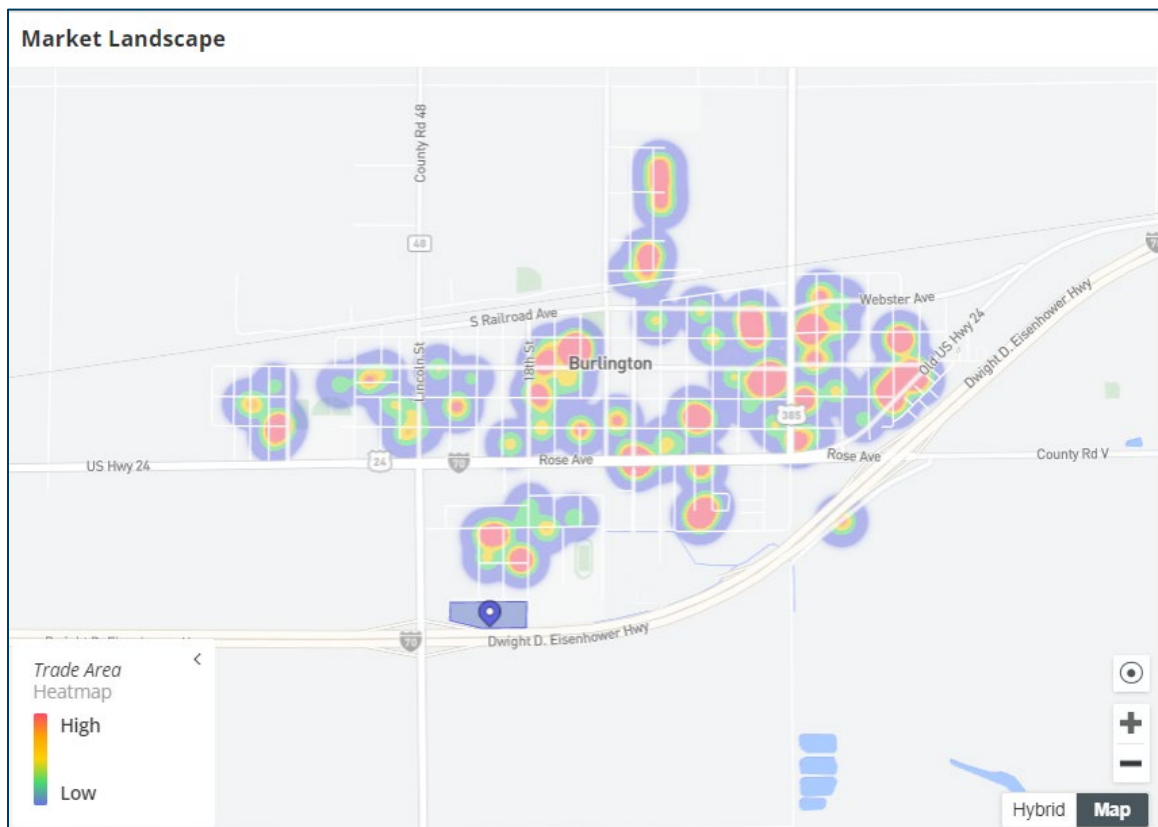


Parmer Park: Local Visitation Heatmap

By identifying the concentration of visitors within the immediate vicinity of Burlington and its surrounding areas, the following observations surfaced:

- Areas closest to Parmer Park, particularly around central Burlington, show the highest visitor concentration. This suggests that Parmer Park primarily serves the local community.
- Surrounding neighborhoods and areas slightly farther from the park also show a good level of visitor engagement, though not as intense as the central areas.

Figure 12: Local Visitation Heatmap (2023)

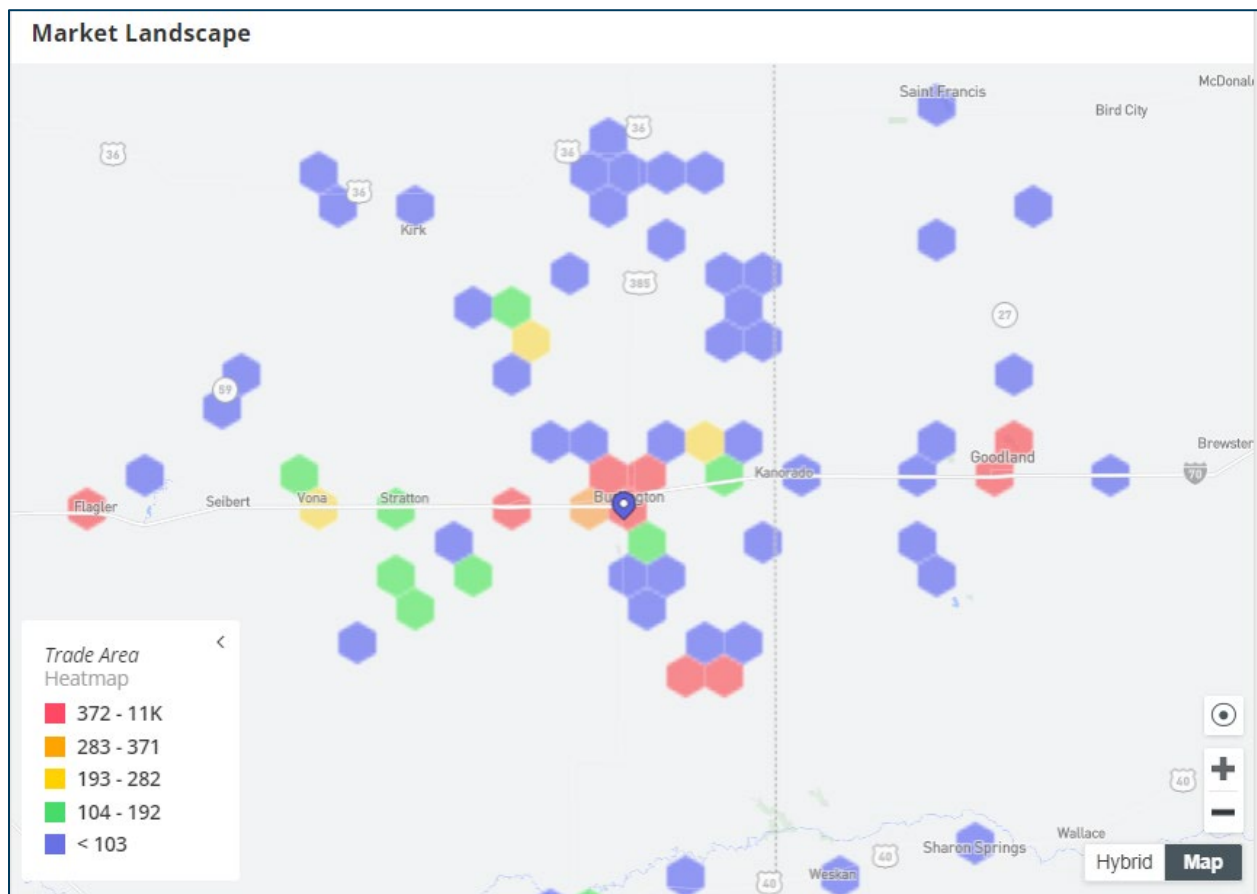


Parmer Park: Regional Visitation Heatmap

This heatmap expands the scope to include a broader region, providing insights into how far people travel to visit Parmer Park:

- **High Visitor Traffic (Red Zones):** These areas, with visitor counts ranging from 372 to 11K, are primarily concentrated in Burlington, indicating a strong local base of park users. Flagler and Goodland also seem to bring in high visitation.
- **Moderate Visitor Traffic (Orange and Yellow Zones):** Surrounding towns like Vona show moderate visitor numbers, suggesting that Parmer Park's appeal extends beyond the immediate locality, attracting visitors who are willing to travel moderate distances.

Parmer Park: Visitor Journey

Visitor Journey is a term that describes the places that a visitor goes to before and after Parmer Park. A significant number of visitors travel directly from home or work and often go to nearby fast-food locations or back home post-visit. Figure 14 provides insights into where visitors were before coming to Parmer Park and where they go afterward:

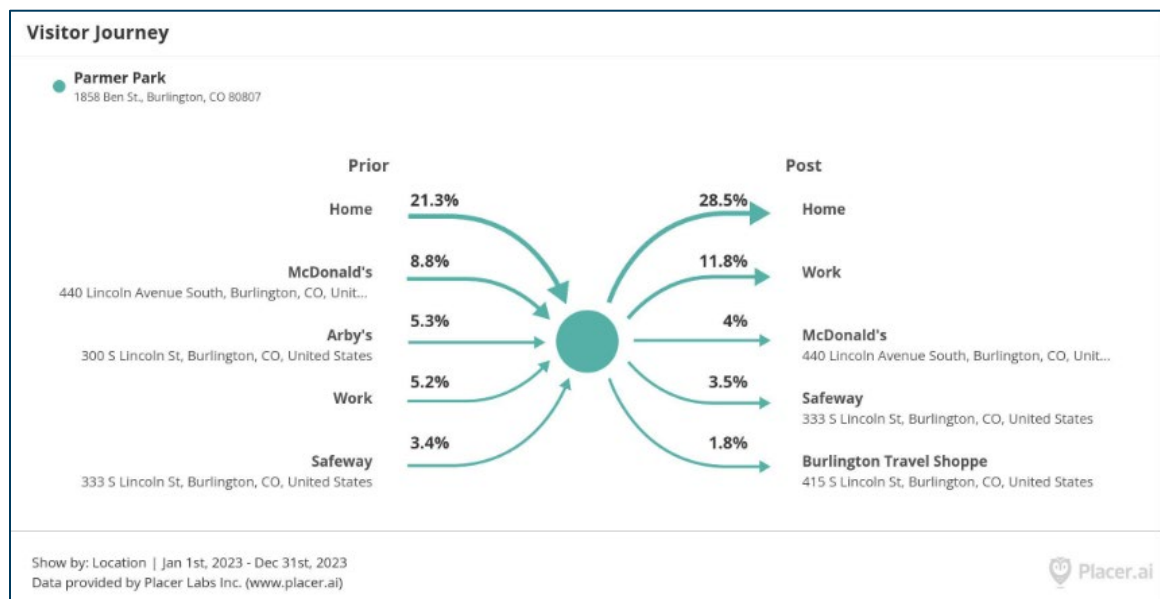
Prior Locations:

- Home: 21.3% of visitors came from home, suggesting that many see the park as a convenient local recreation area.
- McDonald's: 8.8% visited McDonald's before coming to the park.
- Arby's: 5.3% stopped at Arby's.
- Work: 5.2% came directly from work, showing the park serves as a relaxation spot after work hours.
- Safeway: 3.4% visited Safeway first, which might suggest combined trips for shopping and leisure.

Post Locations:

- Home: 28.5% returned home.
- Work: 11.8% headed to work, possibly reflecting lunch breaks or pre-work visits.
- McDonald's: 4% went to McDonald's after visiting the park.
- Safeway: 3.5% visited Safeway after, indicating that visits may be tied to routine shopping trips.
- Burlington Travel Shoppe: 1.8% went to the Burlington Travel Shoppe.

Parmer Park: Favorite Places

The “favorite places” list shows that visitors to Parmer Park also frequent local establishments like Safeway, McDonald's, and Walmart. The proximity and high visit overlap with these locations suggest partnership opportunities for cross-promotions and events that could draw more visitors to the park.

Figure 15: Favorite Places of Park Visitors (2023)

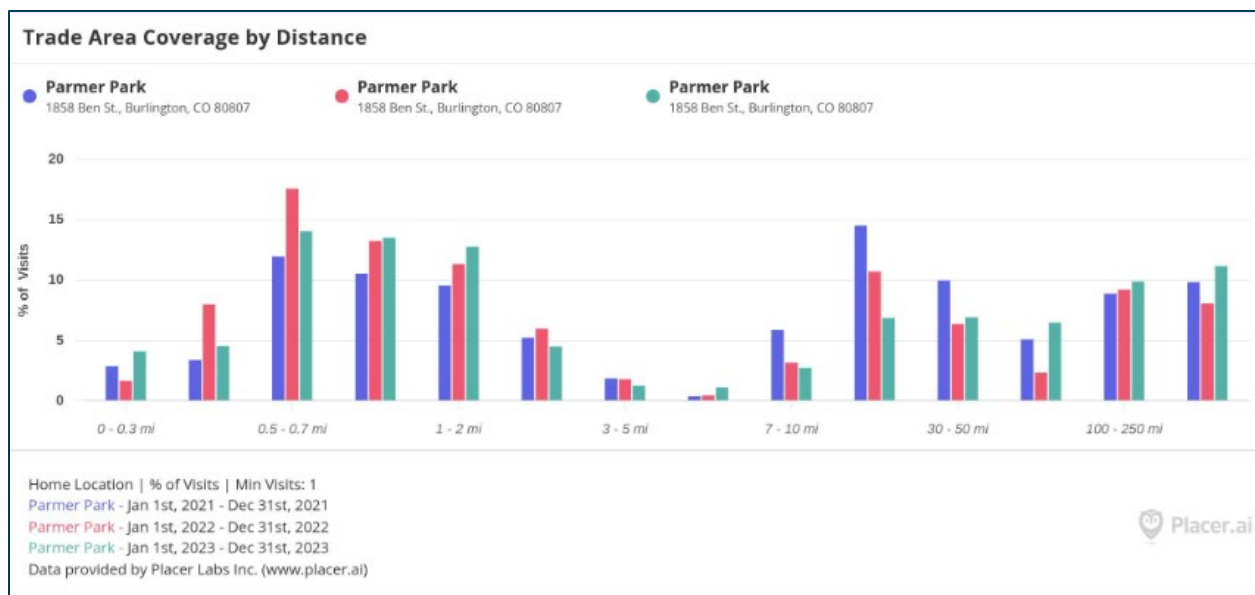

Parmer Park: Trade Area Coverage by Distance

Understanding how far visitors typically travel to Parmer Park provides an indication of where visitors may be traveling from and how far they are willing to travel to Parmer Park.

- **Very Close Proximity (<1 mile):** A slight decrease in visits from the immediate local area suggests a need for re-engaging the closest residents, possibly through community events or park upgrades.
- **Local Area (1 – 5 miles):** Parmer Park remains a popular option for nearby residents who live within a short drive or biking distance.
- **Intermediate Range (6 – 29 miles):** Fluctuations in this distance range could reflect the variable impact of park events and promotions, indicating an opportunity to better capitalize on this demographic with targeted activities.
- **Regional Draw (30 – 99 miles):** Peaks in visitation in 2021 from this distance show the park's potential to attract visitors from a wider area, likely driven by special events or unique park features that draw regional interest.
- **Distant Visitors (>100 miles):** Increasing visits from those living over 100 miles away might suggest the park is an attractive pitstop for those that travel along Interstate 70.

Conclusion

BerryDunn completed this visitation analysis for the City of Burlington, Colorado, focusing on significant areas like Parmer Park, the downtown corridor along 14th Street and Rose Avenue, and Lincoln Street near Highway 70. Utilizing mobility data from Placer.ai, the analysis was intended to highlight trends and patterns that could guide City operations, staffing, and maintenance decisions – in combination with other information collected from the engagement and analysis planning efforts.

A closer examination of Parmer Park reveals declining visitation trends, particularly in overall park usage and dwell time, suggesting a gradual reduction in park popularity. However, the park remains a convenient pit stop for many travelers on I-70, who spend less than 30 minutes at the park.

The Experian Mosaic analysis identifies key visitor groups, including older adults living in retirement communities, families in rural areas, and middle-aged families with school-age children. Visitor preferences align with these demographic groups, which present unique marketing and engagement opportunities.

Improved outreach, special events, and partnerships can attract visitors from moderate-to-high-traffic areas and expand the park's appeal regionally.

To optimize operations at Parmer Park and other key areas, the City could consider prioritizing staffing during peak visitation periods, especially on weekends, to manage the visitor influx effectively. The City can also emphasize the park's appeal for short stops and extended visits. Collaborative efforts with nearby businesses can foster cross-promotion opportunities.

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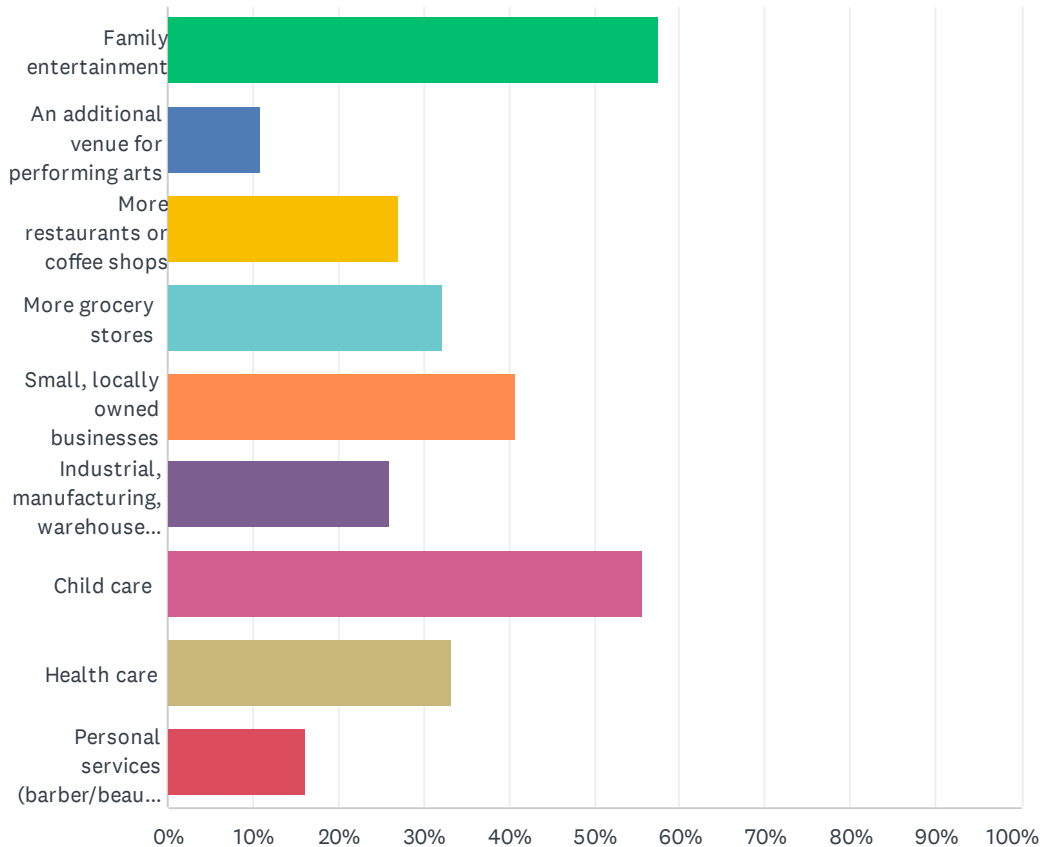

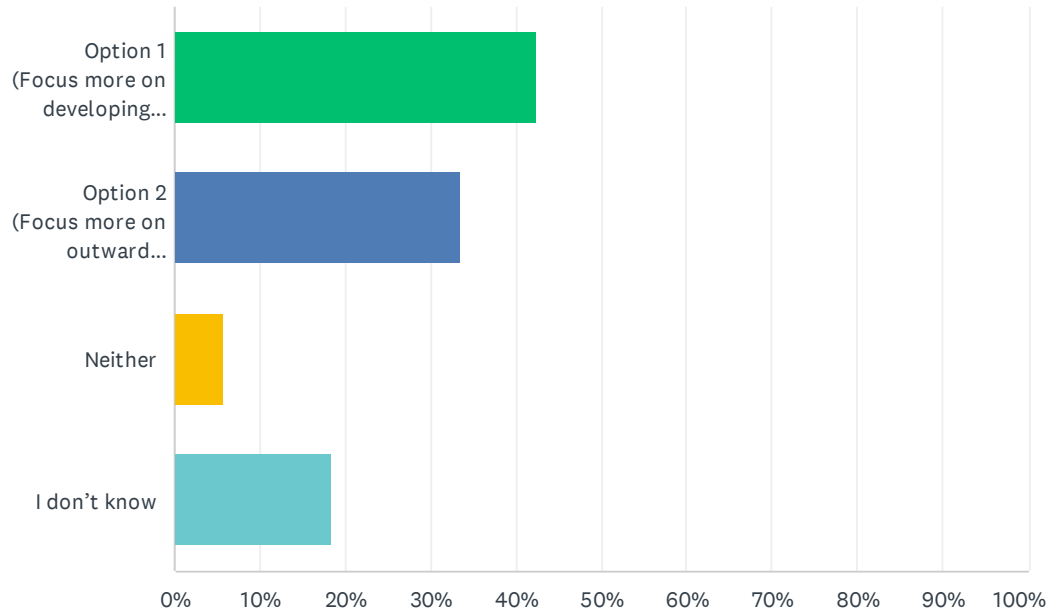

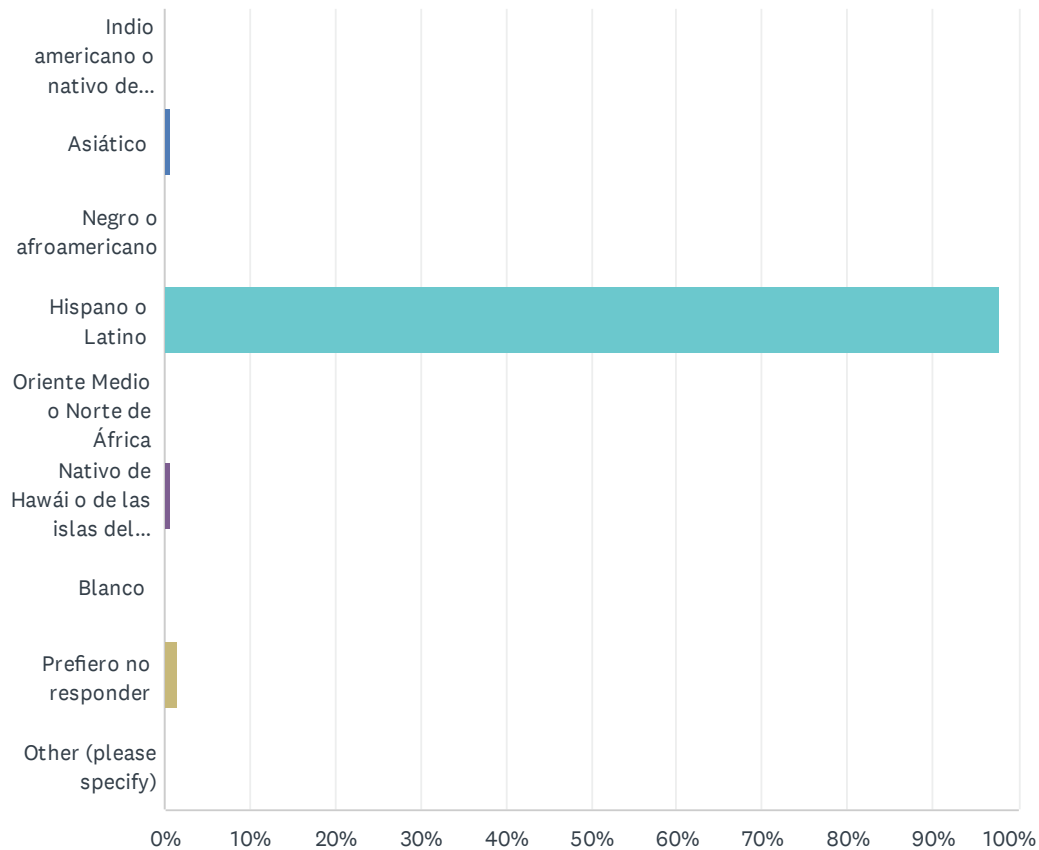

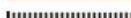

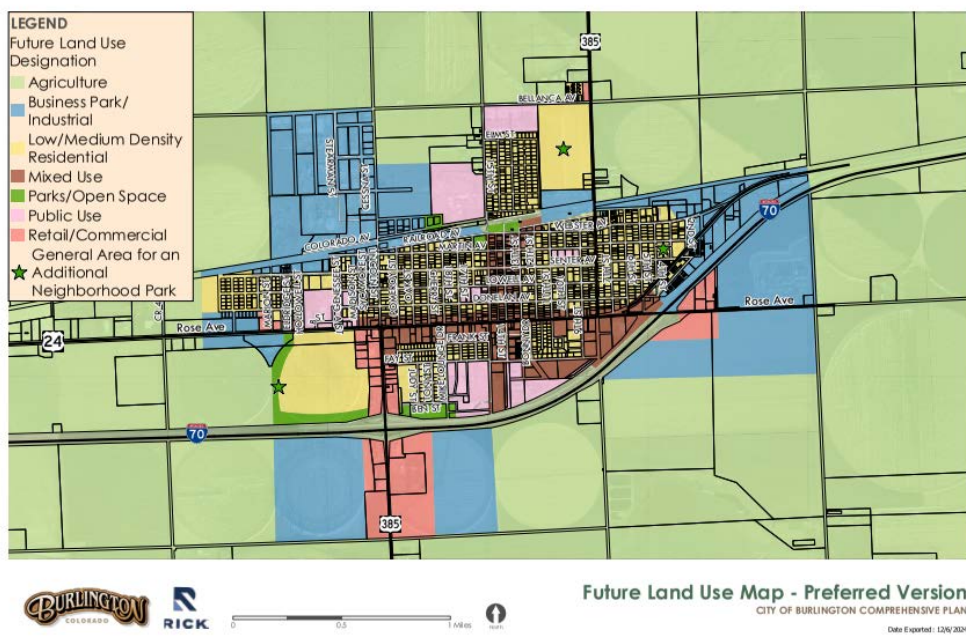

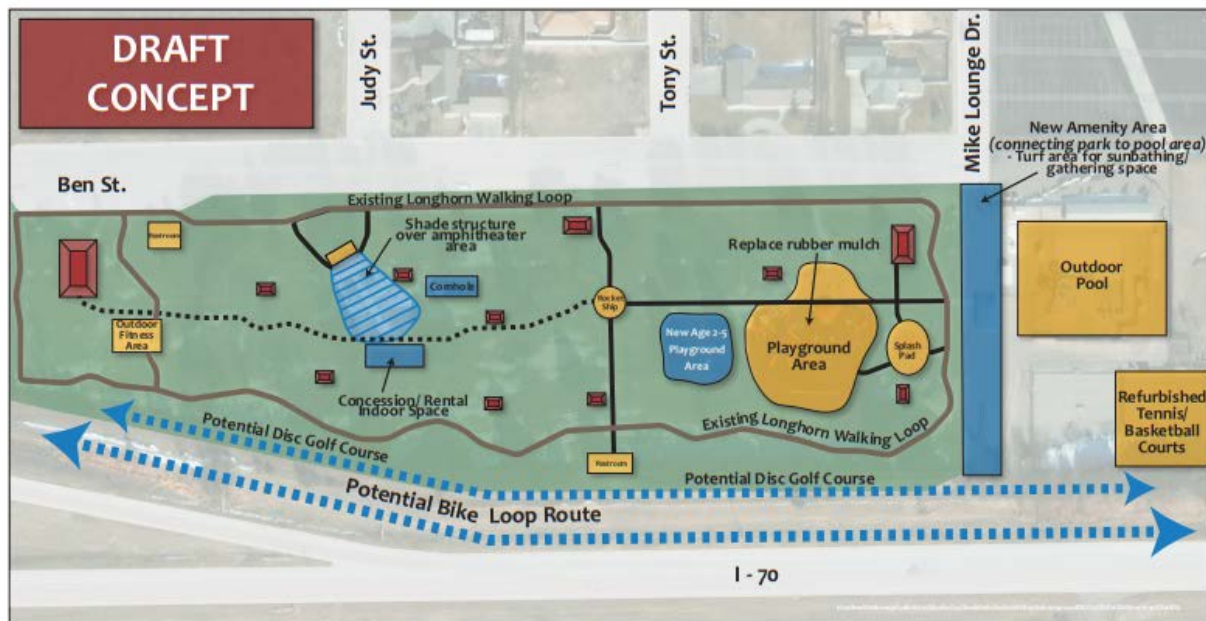

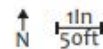

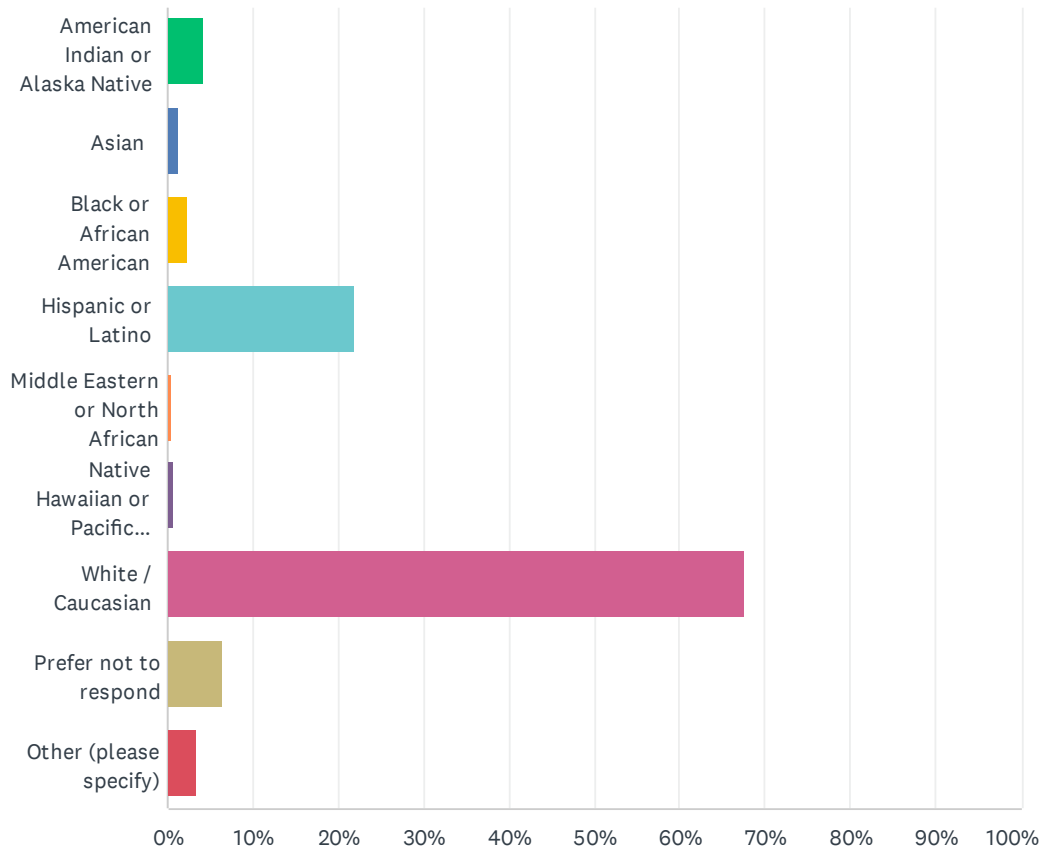

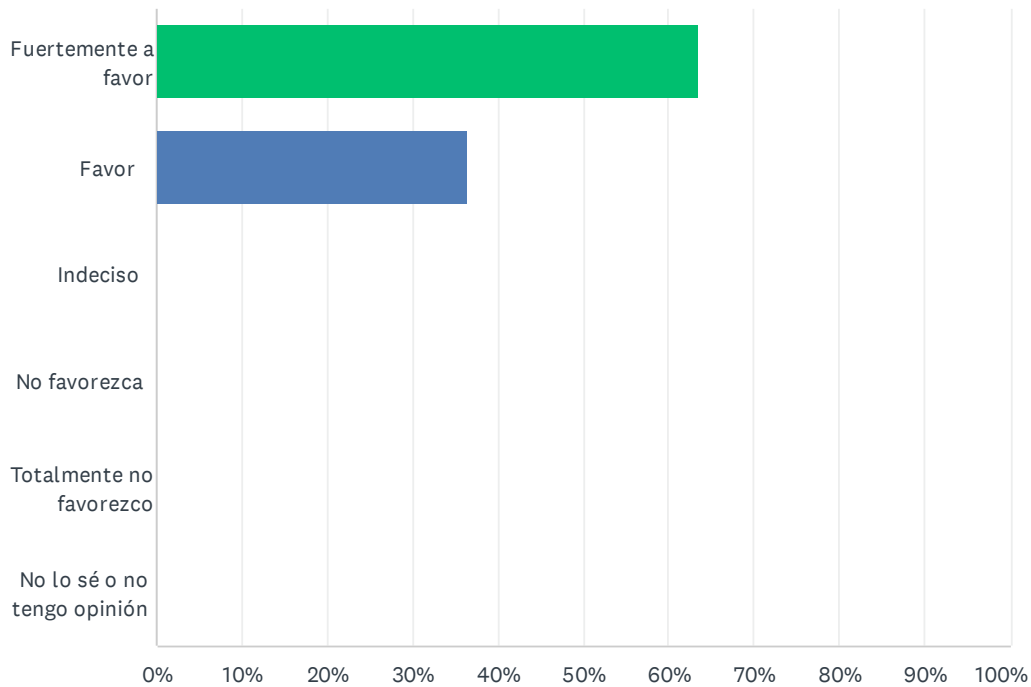

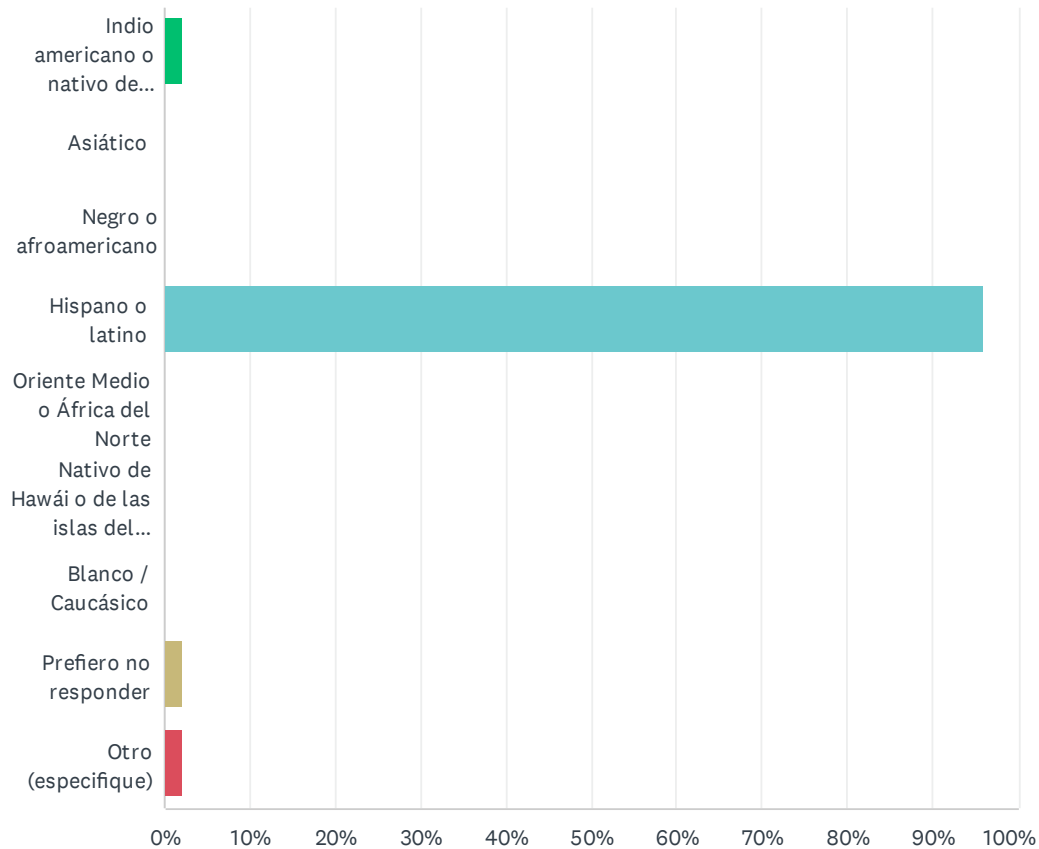
